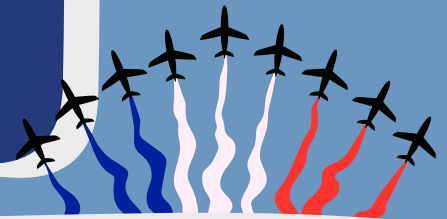


# BASTILLE DAY

The people of France come together on 14th July to commemorate the start of the French Revolution and the end of the Ancien Régime. In 1789, the people of Paris stormed the Bastille, a state prison and fortress, successfully taking it from the control of Louis XVI and giving it to the people.

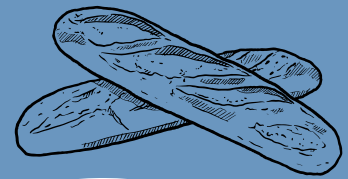
## HOW BASTILLE DAY IS CELEBRATED:

The oldest and largest military parade in Europe processes along the Champs-Élysées from the Arc de Triomphe to the Place de la Concorde. Hundreds of thousands of people gather at the Champ de Mars park and spend the day picnicking with baguettes and wine at the base of the Eiffel Tower. When darkness falls, fireworks light up the sky.
